

**NOTICE TO PERSONS WHO MAY HAVE SUFFERED FROM INADEQUATE
ACCESSIBLE FEATURES AT 170 AMSTERDAM AVENUE**

On March 22, 2018, a settlement was reached to resolve a lawsuit brought by the United States Department of Justice in the United States District Court for the Southern District of New York, which alleged that certain developers failed to include certain accessible features for persons with disabilities required by the Fair Housing Act, 42 U.S.C. § 3604(f)(3)(c), in the design and construction of 170 Amsterdam Avenue.

Under the settlement agreement, a person may be entitled to receive monetary relief if he or she:

- WAS DISCOURAGED FROM LIVING AT 170 AMSTERDAM AVENUE BECAUSE OF THE LACK OF ACCESSIBLE FEATURES;
- HAS BEEN HURT IN ANY WAY BY THE LACK OF ACCESSIBLE FEATURES AT 170 AMSTERDAM AVENUE; OR
- PAID TO HAVE AN APARTMENT AT 170 AMSTERDAM AVENUE MADE MORE ACCESSIBLE TO PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES.
